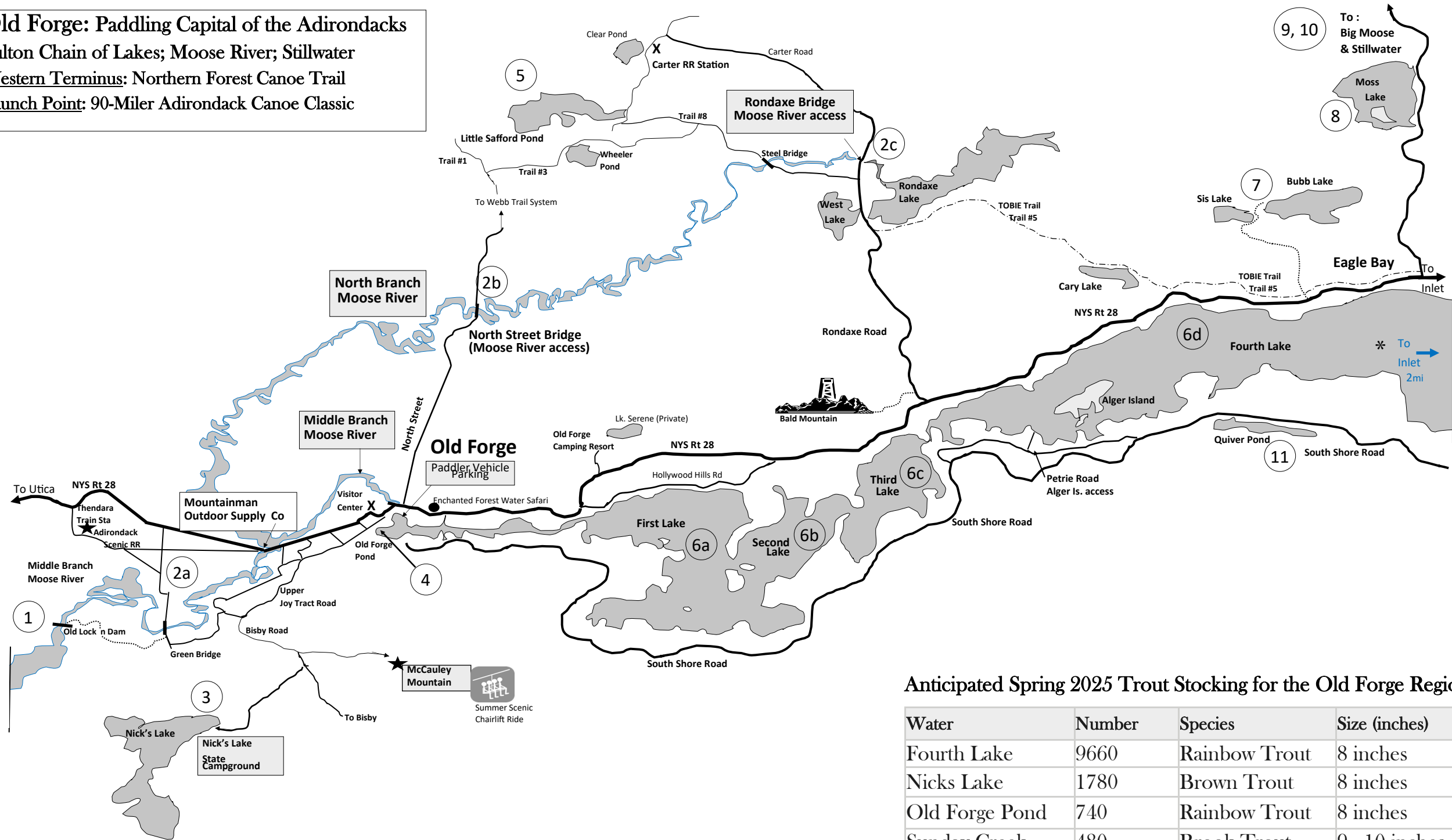


Old Forge: Paddling Capital of the Adirondacks

Old Forge, Your Adirondack Base Camp in the Town of Webb, offers a diversified fishing experience for the novice to the experienced angler. Bass, northern pike, muskie, trout and landlocked salmon are just a sample of the range of fish in our area. Talk to local residents, stop in at a bait shop or hire an experienced guide to learn more about where the fish are biting. Competitive fishing derbies and cash prizes offered all year long.

Winter ice fishing on our majestic frozen lakes offers some of the best fishing all year long. Public fishing is available from state and town land and all of the DEC State Campgrounds.

1. Lock and Dam

Located a mile down the path near Green Bridge, Lock and Dam is a spillway on the Moose River, a scenic little spot to drop a line in. The area is home to small mouth bass, brook trout and muskies. No motorized boats or bait fish allowed.

2. Moose River

The Middle Branch of the Moose River runs right through Old Forge. The river is very shallow in some spots and there is no motorized boat traffic. Canoeing or kayaking is the best way to access good fishing spots. There are put ins at Green Bridge, the Red White and Blue Bridge on North Street and the high bridge on Carter Road off of Rondaxe Road. The river is stocked with trout and has muskies, pike and bass.

3. Nick's Lake

Nicks Lake is a popular summer camping destination which provides anglers with a variety of opportunities. Anglers can expect to catch both largemouth and smallmouth bass along with good numbers of yellow perch. Early season anglers will have the best luck finding brown trout and brook trout. There are no motorized boats or bait fish allowed.

4. Old Forge Pond

Situated in Old Forge with access off Lakeview Ave, Old Forge Pond features a boardwalk and docks for fishing. Rivett's Marine provides motorized boat launches and canoe rentals. Fish species include bullhead, rock bass, pumpkinseed, and perch, with rainbow trout stocked.

5. Little Safford Pond

Located on the Town of Webb trails system, Safford has 2.2 miles of shoreline and allows non-motorized boats. The pond has brook trout, white suckers, pumpkin and yellow perch. Bait fish are not allowed.

6. Fulton Chain of Lakes

(First, Second, Third and Fourth)

There are eight lakes in the Fulton Chain. Fourth is probably the most popular lake in the chain, and is stocked with rainbow trout, lake trout and Atlantic salmon. In addition the lake also has yellow perch, pumpkin and sunfish. First, Second and Third Lakes are not as busy but still offer good fishing with landlocked salmon, muskie, yellow perch and rock bass. The lakes allow motorized boating and bait fish. The Fulton Chain can be accessed via boat launch on Route 28, ten miles from Old Forge.

7. Bubb & Sis Lakes

Bubb and Sis Lakes are located off of Route 28 between Old Forge and Eagle Bay. There is a carry down trail that leads around Bubb and over the spillway between the two lakes. Both lakes have bullhead and are stocked with brook trout. Bait fish are not allowed in either lake. Bubb has 1.5 miles of shore, Sis has 1 mile of shoreline. Neither allow motorized boats.

8. Moss Lake

Moss Lake is located between Eagle Bay and Big Moose, off of Big Moose Lake Road. There is a trail to the lake which has 2.3 miles of shoreline. Bait fish and motorized boats are not allowed. Moss Lake is stocked with lake and brook trout and is also home to yellow perch, Atlantic salmon and bullhead.

9. Big Moose Lake

Big Moose Lake is about 15 miles from Old Forge. Take Big Moose Road in Eagle Bay. Dunn's Boat Service is the only option for motor boat launch. The lake has a nice variety of fish including brook trout, lake trout, perch, bass and sunfish.

10. Stillwater Reservoir

Located 18 miles from Eagle Bay, Stillwater Reservoir is definitely off the beaten path. Motorized boating is allowed and there is a nice DEC boat launch. The lake boasts a variety of fish including splake, brook trout, bass and perch.

11. Quiver Pond

Down South Shore Road, six miles from Inlet, you'll find the lovely Quiver Pond. There is pull off access from South Shore. There are no motorized boats or bait fish. The pond is home to brook trout, bullhead, rock bass and rainbow trout.

Fishing Licenses:
